The staff will also provide projects that are both adult and child led, whilst supporting children with other aspects of their development, such as toilet training, eating independently and school readiness.

Early years education is very important, so for this academic year we will be introducing our new school readiness programme for our preschool children. This will result in them having the range of skills necessary to ensure they have the best possible start to school life. This will be shared with all parents and carers.

With a new influx of children into the nursery, this brings many challenges. These can range from the children settling into their new environment through to the child's learning development and/or behaviours. By gathering information from parents/carers, settling in sessions, observations and tracking development staff will be able to aid the children and their support network in the best way possible.

Of course, starting nursery and having new friends can bring with it a range of challenges. We will work closely with you to get to know your child and our practitioners will encourage the development of strong attachments, so your child feels safe and loved. By working in partnership with you and encouraging settling in sessions, we will ensure the smoothest transition for your child. What's more, our skilled staff will use observations, development tracking and planning in order to scaffold your child's learning in the best way for them.

During the new term we will also be introducing parent workshops. These will address subjects that parents feel that they need assistance such as potty training, speech and language therapy and healthy eating choices etc.

These will be dealt with via prearranged meetings and we welcome your ideas and feedback.

The Nursery is very privileged to be able to offer on site support via our SENDCO, Safeguarding Officer and soon a Domestic Violence coordinator. Please reach out if there is anything we can offer you support with. Our location also lends itself well to access to police services, GP and social care.

We would also like to remind all parents/carers that we operate an open-door policy. If there is ever anything in which you want to talk about or need to know then please come and speak to us. We will do our upmost to assist in any way we can.
